

Developments since 2005

- Creation of IASCL Company limited by guarantee
- IASCL is given charitable status
- Active website with facilities including on-line voting
- New arrangements:
 - Board of Trustees
 - Officers
 - Executive Committee





Changes to Statutes since 2005

- The outgoing president of IASCL automatically becomes a member of the Executive Committee for the next term.
- The Nominating and Appointing Committee appoints new officers in consultation with the Executive Committee.
 Appointments are ratified at the next business meeting.
- The election of new members of the Executive Committee takes place via on-line voting two months before the next Congress. Results are ratified at the business meeting.

- Peer-reviewed abstracts (by Scientific committee members)
- Submission of abstracts through online system
- Abstracts for poster presentations only
- No individual paper submissions (only thematic sessions)
- Number of abstracts to be determined



Handling of posters

- Posters are set up in the morning by 9:00 am
- Posters are discussed each evening 17:00-19:00
- Best student poster award (Scientific Committee)
- First authorship limited to one poster only
- Deadline for submissions: October 15, 2010
- Final acceptance by December 15, 2010



Handling of thematic sessions, etc.

- Invited symposia organizers
- 4 presentations per symposium
- Number of parallel sessions to be determined
- 80 min in all (incl. Q&A)
- All material to be submitted in advance (?)
- No symposium concurrently held with poster sessions
- Deadline for symposium submissions: July 1, 2010
- Notification of acceptance by October 1, 2010

- Early registration until March 1, 2011
- Conference information (partial) available imminently on website.



Format of the congress


- Invited speakers: One keynote speaker each day




